

Proposal from Horst Tielmann to nominate FIS equipment controller also for the Youth Cup Competitions.

Race Director Sandro Pertile proposes an introduction of a new series **NEW STAR CUP** in order to support the development of Ski Jumping on a wider base and to get more Nations involved. With the series we hope to facilitate daily training on the hills, that is the biggest challenge due to limited numbers and access in some countries (both in summer and winter).

The events of the series should facilitate

- development of venues/jumping hills
- development of new officials (TD & judges)
- sharing of knowledge

Basic ideas

- Flexible age group (U9 –U11 U13 U15)
- Flexible HS (from HS 25 to HS 70)
- Four competitions in summer (July August September October)
- Three competitions in winter (January February March)
- Competition organized mainly in developing countries

FIS financial support needs to be provided.

List of ski jumping hills/venues to be included in the series needs to be define.

Homologation process of the jumping hills/venues needs to be defined.

Series rules have to be defined (H. Haim / I. Greger).

Applications for the competition have to be submitted until 31.03.2022. Priority will be given to developing countries.

Five at a time, the nominated Jumping Judges will officiate at the respective Ski Jumping competitions at OWG and SWC, or at the respective competition days at WSFC, taking turns based on a draw decision (in exceptional cases resp. competition management together with resp. s.c. chairman can decide about different system).

The 6th Jumping Judge of the respective competition or competition day will act as start or fall referee (Jury decision).

World Cup Rules Women

4.2 Qualification round

The qualification round reduces the number of participants to 40. Qualification round for KO system competition see art. 4.6.

All jumpers, must participate in the qualification round. The total score counts for the result.

A jumper, who has reached 95 % of the maximum length of the longest jump by the jumpers who have to qualify but has a fall, has the right to participate in the

competition in addition to the 40 (If the wind/gate compensation is used, the compensated distance is the basis).

In case the number of participating athletes is 40 or lower, a Prologue competition round can be organized.

4.6 KO System

The Jumping Committee is entitled to modify the above mentioned rules for the qualification and competition rounds.

Based on a decision of the FIS Jumping Committee and with the approval of the FIS Council with the new modus, the number of participants in the first competition round will be reduced to the half (25 participants) for the final round by a comparison of performance in pairs (KO system) and filled up to a total of 30 participants with the five athletes (best loser) who have reached the best total score points.

4.6.1 The qualification round will be carried out with an exception that the score (the total score points achieved) is not only decisive for the participation in the first competitive round but also for the starting order. The qualification round of competition confirmed in the calendar with KO system reduces the number of participants in the first competition round to 50. In case that number of participants in such a competition is lower than 50, KO system will be not used and all entered participants will start in the first competition round.

4.6.2 The first competition round is contested by 25 pairs of jumpers so that exactly 50 athletes have to be selected in the qualification round. It is therefore not possible to increase this number in case of several competitors in equal last places or maximum distance with a too low total score because of a fall. In order to respect fairness and to ensure a clear decision, the following rules are to be observed:

4.6.2.1 If two or more jumpers obtain the same total score in the Qualification round, the athlete with the higher start number will be ranked in the better position (see ICR art. 433.4).

4.6.3 Based on these rules, the following system is in place for the ranking of the qualification round:

Based on the total scores achieved, firstly a normal ranking from positions 1 to 50 is to be established.

4.6.4 For the first competition round the pairs of jumpers are to be established as follows:

4.6.5 The pairs will start in the following order:

Start no. 26	against start no. 25	as 1 st pair
Start no. 27	against start no. 24	as 2 nd pair
etc.	etc.	etc.
Start no. 49	against start no. 02	as 24 th pair
Start no. 50	against start no. 01	as 25 th pair

4.6.6 As a result of the comparison in pairs the jumper with the better total scoring reaches the final round. If the two jumpers competing against each other achieve the same total score, the jumper with the lower start number will advance.

etc.

4.6.7 Those 25 athletes will participate in the final round who have qualified for the final in the KO elimination. In addition there are the five losing jumpers which have the best total scores. In exceptional cases of a lower number of winners, the number of losing jumpers will be increased. The number of participants for the second round can also be increased through tied jumpers on the last qualified place or/and jumpers who have reached 95 % of the longest jump (art. 4.2.1.3) but had a fall (If the wind/gate compensation is used, the compensated distance is the basis).

4.6.8 The starting order in the final round results from the reverse ranking order of the total scores in the first scoring round.

In case of equal total scores the jumper with the higher starting number will jump first.

The overall score of the competition is determined by the total scores from both competitive rounds, i.e. the sum of both total scores. Unanimously accepted by the Committee

Rule changes

Guidelines for the Measuring Procedure

Athlete must be standing up in a relaxed position during the measuring. Athlete must be stripped down to shorts and barefoot. Only "slip-type" of underwear is allowed (see pic. A-men; B-women).

Athlete will have to change her/his piece of underwear in the presence of the controller prior to the measurement.

Inside the suit just above the hip bones of the athlete a non-stretchable strap must be sown around horizontally from zipper to zipper. This strap must be 2-4 cm wide and maximum 2 mm thick. The measured circumference of this part of the suit - 5 cm above and 5 cm below the lower seam of the strap, incl. the strap itself, even when the suit is stretched, must not exceed the respective body measurement. The transition from the close-fitted part of the suit (+/- 5 cm from the strap) to the allowed tolerance in the suit size must be gradual, without any additional curves.

Underwear

The underwear is consisting of two parts (shirt and pants), made of homogenous elastic material:

- A zipper in the middle of the front part of the shirt is allowed.
- When using a back protector inside the shirt, a full-length zipper is mandatory.
- Overlapping and seams must be maximum 5 mm thick.

4.3 Underwear

The thickness of the underwear must not exceed 5,0.3,0 mm (cumulative - all layers and parts of the underwear together).

Requirements for Equipment Control Room Ski Jumping

to be included

For COC and FIS Cup events, the NSA must nominate an assistant per gender for start control by name in the invitation.

Fluor ban

FIS sent out a Declaration of Consent to Suppliers and NSAs

Regulations apply from the season 2021/2022 onwards.

As a result, production, trade and use of certain fluorinated waxes containing C8/PFOA is prohibited.

Use and possession of any ski waxes containing fluorine, without exceptions, for all FIS events (Art. 222.8 ICR) effective from season 2022/2023 onwards.

FIS has been informed by IBU that Bavarian authorities are ready to execute tests locally.

Calendar Planning

Mario Stecher

Mario Stecher comments on the summer season. Contrary to last year, the calendar was back to the number of events from before the pandemics, and most of the competitions were realised without any problems. There were some events (especially Kazakhstan and Russia) where the participation form strongest nations were modest.

Chairman of the sub-committee informs that calendar applications for the future have to be submitted by end of March 2022 3/5 years ahead for all the series.

<u>Calendar Planning 2022/23</u> Presentation of first draft of the FIS summer Grand Prix 2022 and FIS World Cup Men and Women calendars 2022/23. Final version will be discussed during the FIS Sub-Committee Calendar Planning meeting in Spring 2022.

Great opportunity to define a Long Term Strategy for FIS World Cup and a Middle Term Strategy for FIS COC and FIS Cup.

NSA are requested to send their applications at least for the <u>next three seasons</u> for World Cup/Summer Grand Prix (2022/23 – 2023/24 and 2024/25) and next two seasons for FIS COC and FIS Cup Summer and Winter.

Deadline:

- Within 31st March 2022 NSA will send applications to FIS
- April 2022 Draft of calendar will be presented during FIS Calendar Planning Sub-Committee meeting
- Within 20th September 2022 (before Autumn meeting) NSA send applications for season 2025/26

Calendar planning is taking into consideration the following principles and priorities:

- 1. To reach the highest possible number of nations and develop ski jumping sport worldwide.
- 2. To prioritise venues, dates and times favourable for a good TV exposure and the development of events.
- 3. To include those Organizers that are creating great platforms for athletes, teams, media and spectators through events that are well organized and highly appreciated by all the client groups.
- 4. To optimise the financial sustainability for the teams and LOCs.
- 5. To guarantee gender equality with the appropriate number of competitions for both genders, possibly with several joint events.
- 6. Climate change to optimise our environmental footprint with the optimisation of travels and logistics.

Statement from the Jumping Committee for FIS Council – re-investment from WSC into SJ – Falun – development and smaller hills –

Rule changes

World Cup Rules Men

2.2.2 World Cup Ski Jumping and Ski Flying team events

a) four competitors per team, who are born in 2006 or earlier and

b) minimum three competitors per team, who have already gained GP or WC points or

c) who have gained at least one COCJ-M point of the past or of the current season.

d) maximum one competitor per team, who have gained at least one FIS Cup-M point of the past or of the current season.

3.2.2.1 Only teams, which entered four athletes according to art. 2.2.2 physically present on site of the event, can be entered for respective team or mixed team competition.

3.2.3. Starting order in team competitions

3.2.3.1. In the second round, only the leading eight (8) nations from the first round are entitled to start. Before the start of the last every group in the final round, there will be an info break, where the start order for the last next group will be sorted into reversed order of the current standing.

Proposal to extend the test phase into the winter season (without Olympics). Unanimously accepted by the Committee

Evaluation criteria for development of women's ski jumping

- FIS Race Directors and Coordination Board members agree on a clear and precise way to evaluate development of Women Ski Jumping
- Criteria will support the Ski Jumping family to address future steps, <u>without an</u> <u>emotional approach</u>
- These criteria will guide FIS Calendar Sub-committee into future decision and are involving a lot of experts.

TECHNICAL PARAMETERS:

1. Analysis of gap (points/meters) between 1° - 10° - 20° - 30° - 40° in all the competitions of the last 3 seasons (summer and winter). This will be analysed also through some average value for groups of athletes.

- 2. Analysis of number of competitions on Normal and Large Hill in the last three seasons.
- 3. Special attention on the competition in Willingen and all other Large Hills used during the seasons 2020/21 and 2021/22.
- 4. Willingen 2022: analysis of inrun/landing speed through the Swiss Timing Motion Sensors

SPECIFIC PARAMETERS IN PREPARATION FOR FUTURE SKI FLYING COMPETITIONS:

- 1. Technical analysis of Ski Flying jumping hills (Kulm Oberstdorf Planica Vikersund)
- 2. Analysis of the expected inrun and landing speed for Ski Flying hills based on the statistics from Mixed Team events on Normal and Large Hills and the outcome of the Motion Sensor technology experience.
