# 5. Approval of the minutes of the meeting Sub-Committee for Rules and Control Cross-Country, Zoom platform, 16.05.2022

The minutes are approved.

#### 6. Report and information from the FIS Race Director

Pierre Mignerey informed the S.C. members about the long-term goal to integrate Para-Nordic in all areas of Cross-Country Skiing. Integration will include ICR, TD education, homologation etc. The goal is to have Para-Nordic fully integrated until after 2026. Key persons in the FIS Para Nordic team are Elke Gundermann, FIS Para Nordic Coordinator and Georg Zipfel, FIS Para Nordic Race Director.

#### 7. Proposals and issues from other Sub-Committees

#### 7.1 S.C. for Roller Skiing

The S.C. for Roller Skiing submitted following proposals to adjust ICR articles in Rollerski ICR (Section H):

- 396.7 Coaching zones and Refreshment Stations
- 396.7.1 During competitions which are 8 km or less, refreshment services are on-ly permitted in the Finish Zone after the finish line.
- 396.7.2 For competitions longer than 8 km but less than 30 km, refreshment ser-vices are allowed along the course without the use of motorized vehicles. For competitions longer than 30 km, motorbikes may be allowed at the discretion of the Jury.
- 396.7.1 For uphill competitions tThe Jury may decides about number and locations of the coaching zones and refreshment stations on the competition course.
- 396.7.2 The Jury may decide whether team officials can use bicycles (or similar means of transportation) to reach refreshment stations or coaching areas. In such case, the team officials are only allowed to move to the respective zones and provide assistance in accordance with ICR 344.2. They are not allowed to follow the athletes along the course.

Pace maker in roller skiing - a case occurred in Amatrice WC, but at the moment Roller skiing S.C. has no intention to react with new rules.

#### 7.2 S.C. for Popular Cross-Country

Robert Peets will take over the coordination work of TD nomination for Worldloppet, Euroloppet and Ski Classics popular competitions. Regional TD coordinators should help Robert Peets with nominating the right candidates. Final TD nomination will be published on the FIS website.

#### Guide for TD's LOC's Long Distance Popular Races VS ICR

Thomas Unterfrauner is given the task to check if the Guide for TDs and LOCs for long distance popular competitions is aligned with ICR. Update is expected for the spring meeting.

#### 7.3 Others

ICR 317.2.5 says that all official results must also be electronically transmitted to FIS in XML format. The deadline for sending it in the timing booklet should be the same as the one in ICR for TD report (3 days) and XML should have the field with date and time of official result (not compulsory).

For Children and Master races TD should send PDF results to the FIS Nordic Office for the publication.

#### 8. ICR matters

The FIS Council in August 2022 approved to increase the daily allowance for competition officials from CHF 100 net to CHF 125 net. This increase is valid for competition officials at WC, WSC, JWSC and COC. ICR 304.1.1 is updated accordingly.

304.1.1 [...] In addition a fixed daily rate of CHF 100 net (CHF 125 net for WC, WSC, JWSC, COC events) is added for the travel days to and from, as well as each day of the assignment, which includes postage charges for mailing reports, etc.

In addiction the following is added (decision was taken in spring, only wording was missing):

304.1.4 In Case of late protests (ICR 387.2) or appeals against the jury decisions (ICR 662), the TD has the right to reimbursement of one additional day.

Pierre Mignerey stressed out that reimbursement should be considered as compensation for the costs related to the TD assignment and not as income. Some TDs have experienced issues with their tax declaration. If necessary, FIS Nordic office can help to issue an official confirmation.

#### 9. FIS Points and calendar

FIS Points Rules (changes valid for season 2022/23)

- 2.1.6 Distance FIS points in senior class will only be awarded for competitions 5 km or more
  - 5 km or more for women
  - 10 km or more for men

#### 2.1.7 Roller Skiing

Sprint FIS Points will be awarded only for Sprint Qualification and for competitions longer than 800 m.

Distance FIS points in senior class will only be awarded for competitions 5 km or more.

- 5 km or more for women
- 10 km or more for men

2.1.8 FIS long distance popular competitions

FIS points will be distributed for all FIS long distance popular competitions with a distance of 30km or more and a minimum of 5 athletes with FIS Code crossing the finish line.

Exception approved by the R&C Sub Committee:

Kortelopet (also counting for Continental Cup series)

All ranked athletes with active FIS Code will be taken into consideration for the FIS points calculation.

Petr Mach prepared new wording for the FIS Points system approved in spring:

#### FIS Points Rules (changes valid for season 2023/24)

- 5.2 FIS Points
- 5.2.4 The maximum value of FIS Points is 999. If any competitor has more FIS points in any calculation, the value 999 is used
- 5.3.1.2 The FIS points of the top five competitors (Art. 5.3.1.1) from the actual FIS points list are considered. Competitors with lowest points and with highest points are removed. Remaining values are added and the three best values are added and divided by 3.753.5. This is the race penalty. The points shall be rounded down from four thousandths of a point downwards and rounded up from five thousandths of a point upward (e.g. 13.654 = 13.65 or 21.849 = 21.85).

For Roller Ski races, in order to oblige TD to check the TC (that determined the factor) some fields will became compulsory in the TD report - Ulf Seehase.

#### 10. Feedbacks from FIS Nordic Office / FIS IT

Following the data collected with the Timing Report process, specifics should be now mentioned in the ICR. Sanna Hallberg Peterson will work on the draft of the rules prepared by Ulf Seehase.

#### 11. Homologation matters

Allan Serrano presented the summary of the activities and the homologation seminar. The statistics show that there are 46 nations with at least one homologated course, 62 homologation inspectors and candidates, 370 venues with 1810 homologated courses and that every year around 10 WC level venues and around 55/60 COC level venues are

#### homologated.

Following changes of homologation norms were presented and approved by the S.C:

311.2.5.3 For courses 15 km in length and less, the actual length should be not less than 5% shorter or 10% longer than the nominal course length.

#### **Homologation manual**

The S.C. also discussed the modification of the Homologation manual and education/appointment of homologation inspectors.

Inspection and certificates procedures should stay in the Homologation manual, suggestions and best practice should be put under the title Guidelines for course design, while norms (and tables) should be only in ICR.

Guidelines for course design will have to include technical contents:

- Broader guidelines = variety of courses
- Practical evaluation methods
- Checklist of things to take care of
- Big events requirements
- Para integration
- No names

A flexible working group shall be established, which will involve:

- Involve specialists (Coaches, Organizers, TDs,...) to be up to date with sport
- Mission comes from the S.C.
- Para integration

Allan Serrano will lead this field of work and the working group.

#### **Education of FIS Officials (TDs and HIs)**

One document will be elaborated, which will describe organization, education, and appointment of technical officials (both TDs and HIs).

It should contain validity of TDs and HIs license (4 years), how to keep valid the license (TD and HI should take part in TD/HI seminar during the validity period) and appointment procedures.

The nomination of HI could be the following:

- For homologation of course level 1 (COC, FIS)
  - NSA applies and proposes a HI
  - FIS Nordic Office appoints
    - Given HI
    - HI paperwork controller from a list of experts (previous regional coordinators plus some other expert HIs)

#### ■ For homologation of course level 2 (OWG, WSC, U23 WSC, JWSC, WC)

- NSA applies
- o RD + HI Coordinator (WG chair) + R&C S.C. Chair propose HI
- FIS Nordic Office appoints
  - Given HI
  - HI coordinator (WG chair) as HI paperwork controller (in case the HI is the HI coordinator (WG chair), then one of the experts above will control)

S.C. chair Anna Rosa will lead the work and present a concrete proposal in spring 2023. Allan Serano will be integrated in the preparation work, together with Annmari Viljanmaa and Petr Mach - CEE Regional TD Coordinator.

FIS IT will work on having the list of HIs on the FIS website and validity license for both TDa and His

#### 12. TD matters

#### 12.1 TD Report

New online TD report is used and works well. Annmari Viljanmaa will point out to FIS IT which fields are not needed for races with no XML results, so to implement the TD report also for Children and Master races.

#### 12.2 TD Seminars

TD and homologation seminars should be organized in the following way:

- 2/3 days (preferably from Friday evening)
- FIS Nordic Office sends the Official invitation
- Regional coordinator sends the list of participants to the FIS Nordic Office
- Valid for renewing the license
- New candidates admitted
- Exams

Shortcuts to the training period for TD candidates must be approved by the S.C. and at least 1 assignment during the assessment period (2 years) must be done at a cross-country skiing event.

TD Updates can be held in the year when in the region there is no seminar and should be organized in the following way:

- 2/3 hours online
- FIS Nordic Office sends the Official invitation
- Not valid for renewing the license
- New candidates NOT admitted
- No exams
