## 1. Welcome and Opening Remarks

Dear Freestyle Friends

Welcome once again to the Autumn meetings of the FIS Freestyle Sub Committee.

The past months since our Spring meetings in Portoroz has seen our Southern Winter season come and go! It was another challenging snow season for Australia and to a lesser extent New Zealand. South America fared better with Mogul teams training in Chile and Argentina. There is clearly opportunity to grow our sport in the Southern Hemisphere with teams prepared to travel but very little CoC and FIS level competitions being held on snow in Moguls and Aerials outside of Australia.

The difficult snow conditions in Australia resulted in the cancellation of events both at the Continental Cup level and FIS/National event level. Despite this Perisher was once again able to deliver a world class mogul course and CoC event and remains a popular destination for visiting international teams.

Whilst the FIS Summer Grand Prix series for Aerials was held over until 2025, it was great to see several FIS level water-jump competitions run in many locations including Switzerland, USA, Austria, China, Czech and Australia. With updated Summer Grand Prix rules being considered at these meeting it is hoped we will see the series return in 2025 with more hosts and participation from Nations as we collectively balance team training needs, budgets and athlete competition opportunities.

Over the past month you will know that we called for expressions of interest for members of the Freestyle community to join the various advisory groups. The FIS Freestyle Executive is committed to ensuring Advisory Groups are efficient, expert, and well-connected to their communities. A process of assessment and "refresh" ultimately helps ensure the right mix of skills and experience to meet the Committee's strategic objectives. While current Advisory Groups have been effective, it is timely to evaluate their capacity and impact, including how members support professional staff and engage the broader community. We are encouraged by the interest expressed in joining the advisory groups and we look forward to finalising these shortly. Each Advisory Group and Working Group will propose a chair, subject to approval by the FIS Freestyle Executive.

Additionally at the Zurich meetings we have scheduled a special Aerial Advisory Group "Taskforce" meeting to specifically discuss some of the challenges and opportunities available to grow the sport of aerial skiing. It is no secret that the World Cup calendar is facing challenges with certain traditional host nations unable to run events currently. We look forward to discussing how the active nations in terms of those that invest in programs, facilities and/or events can collaborate to drive growth in the sport into the future.

More broadly our committee is beginning a process to define a future vision. "Where do we see Freestyle in 10 years?". I am grateful to Anders Olofsson and Joe Fitzgerald who have begun framing the process and we look forward to an update at the meeting.

We are now inside 500 days from the opening of 2026 Milan Cortina Olympic Winter Games and the Olympic Qualification period has effectively commenced. I recently visited the Olympic venue in Livigno and I have no doubt it will be an amazing showcase for Freestyle Skiing with the Aerial site and Mogul venue side by side. As we all know Dual Moguls will make an Olympic Debut and we all know what an incredible show it will be.

Congratulations also to Iain Mackay (GBR) who was recently confirmed by council as the latest Honorary Member of the FIS Freestyle Sub-Committee.

I wish you good meetings.

## 2. Reports FIS

### 2.1 Chair's Report

### 2.2 Race Director Report

Since last May's FIS Meeting in Portoroz SLO and the FIS Meetings in Zurich, I have traveled extensively and invested a lot of time in consolidating existing and proven relationships as well as cultivating new relationships and potential new stakeholders in the freestyle world, consequently I can summarize it with the following visits:

- **Switzerland:** visit and inspection with related preparatory meeting for the World Championships in St. Moritz, visit to Mettmenstetten for training and preparation for the Waterjump competition.
- **Italy:** visit and check of the ongoing work on the new 2026 Olympic courses and preparation of the WC Finals, now definitively confirmed.
- **Azerbaijan:** visit and inspection of Shahdag, intending to host events in the future.
- **Georgia:** with classic inspection in Bakuriani and a visit to Gudauri to assess possible future collaborations.
- **Armenia:** visit to 3 ski resorts in full development in winter sports.
- **Kazakhstan:** with inspection and definition of AE venue improvement projects for WJC and WC, and visit to Oi-Qaragai for future events especially in the Moguls.

- **France:** with visit to Alpe d'Huez for planning and preparation of the now classic MO and DM World Cup.
- **USA:** with inspection in Deer Valley, Lake Placid and Waterville Valley for World Cup competitions; Park City to attend FIS WaterJump competition.
- **Canada:** with inspection and visit to Val St. Come and Lac Beauport for traditional World Cup stages; visit to Mt. St. Anne. Attendance at the Waterjump competition.
- **China:** with visit to Shenyang, Changchung, Beidahu and Arshan locations for World Cup races and future development plans for international events. As well as a most interesting visit to the Qinhuangdao National Training Center for the 2 WaterJump competitions.

Unfortunately, I had to leave out for now Scandinavia, where anyway OCs are established and there were no real urgencies to deal with at the moment.

However, the list is long and there are many projects and ideas on the table, it is now a matter of consolidating some of them by opening new and further perspectives for the future of freestyle.

### 2.2.1 WC TV Data

It was my intention to report TV statistics with an in-depth analysis on the data provided by Infront; after looking at the data several times and finding several inconsistencies I don't think it is useful to report specific data that have no solid basis for analysis. Let me draw attention to just a few pieces of data:

- Ruka AE 32 million viewers, FS/FK/SB event by far with the highest number of viewers.
- AE Deer Valley 6.5 million, AE Lac-Beauport 4.5 million.
- Changchun AE/AET, 170,000 total viewers?
- MO/DM Alpe d'Huez season 2023, 3.5 million viewers, 2024, 90,000?

Also, there are too many inconsistencies between the report provided by FIS M&M and that of Infront, as well as on the takers list and the one then actually displayed in the statistics.

I think and hope that in the future we could be more precise to provide our organisers with good tools to work with.

### 2.2.2 WJC 2025, future

As you all know I'm particularly and historically connected to the World Junior Championships, during my coaching career I have often participated in these events, I have been involved in at least 10-15 editions as an organiser, from Chief of Course to Chief of Competition, from TD to RD. Linked to this I have emphatically promoted the return of freestyle to the Youth Olympic Games.

I think it is essential that this event be constantly on our calendar in the future, if then Moguls and Aerials can also be combined with other Snowboard and Freeski events, so much the better, but surely, we must ensure its annual organisation.

Having said that I have to say that there are many locations and some NSAs interested but as of today we don't have a real candidate for the 2026 season where we should go back to placing the event in a traditional way at the end of the season, the interested ones now are the following:

- Arshan (CHN) exclusively with Aerials.
- Airolo (SUI), Valmalenco (ITA) and Jyväskylä (FIN), for Moguls and Aerials only.
- Are-Duved (SWE) with something combined with SX and P&P, perhaps excluding Aerials.



- Canada and Czech Republic with undefined projects.

FIS M&M is paying special attention to this event; this year it will be more involved in the promotion and production of the Almaty competitions. We will have a presentation at the end of the Subcommittee meeting today.

It would be important for me and my colleagues to receive an official bid as soon as possible to submit to the Council for approval and so then to be able to start working calmly.

### **2.2.3 FIS Freestyle Education Plan**

At the Strategy and Projects meeting the new strategy of the FIS Education department was presented by Cornelia Blank, area manager, the presentation was very precise and clear.

This is a new step forward for FIS and all disciplines, especially for freestyle it will be of great help in implementing our Online, Onsite and Onsnow education strategy in various areas ranging from judges to technical delegates, from homologators to data service managers.

Please see the presentation attached to the meeting documents and contact Cornelia or me for further clarification.

Overall, FIS education strategy will cover formal (i.e., licensed) and informal (i.e., information, awareness) education. The current focus is set on the formal education that aims at the development of different target groups including technical officials, coaches, athletes, and NSA. Starting with the technical officials, the first layer of the education strategy focuses on strategic decisions how the set-up should be implemented. Currently, we are working on the second layer defining the pathways of education of different roles in close cooperation with the respective disciplines. After finishing the second layer, the third layer will address the actual content and how this will be delivered.

### **2.2.4 FIS Freestyle GRAND PRIX 2025**

I visited all Water Jump competitions around the world except for Brisbane AUS and Štítý CZE, the main purpose was to get a clear idea of what the future of Water Jump Grand Prix could be and the possibility of promoting this different vision of our sport as well.

After today's approval of the rules, it is my intention to prepare as soon as possible a calendar proposal to submit to the NSAs and Aerials Team, considering the geographical and sport implications.

Also very interesting is Australia's innovative proposal to offer an WC Opening on the Water Jump ramp in Brisbane Australia.

Summer calendar and evolution of the sport to be followed with much interest.

## **2.3 Athletes Report**

There is the following news from the athletes' side: we were able to secure a permanent athlete spot on all technical committees. What we also achieved, which could be very interesting for you, is that we are allowed to nominate an athlete who is not on the Athletes' Committee for certain committees. This means it would be possible to nominate a mogul or aerial athlete to represent the athletes in the Freestyle Sub-Committee.

We are also looking for a candidate for the WADA Athlete Council. Every international federation is allowed to put one name forward for the vote. The Athlete does not need to be a member of the FIS Athletes' Committee.

- 6204.1, Change agreed to change Mogul turn scoring to Carving 60% - Upper body 20%-absorption to 20% from previous 50%-25%-25% criteria.
- 6204.1.5 Change wording for turns 'Average' changes to 'Adequate', 'Below Average' changes to 'Managing'
- The ranges category of MO Turn stays in 5 sections (Proposal to split the Excellent range into Very Good and Excellent was not agreed).
- Deduction scores, MAG wants judges to give base and deduction scores for all runs, (The proposal was not agreed if there are more than 12 points as deduction – no score).

One group of the next WC judges will use the system for training and another group can use for online training. Details still to be worked out.

### **3.2.2 Chair's Report (Assignments)**

#### **Ruka 2023 in person Level 3 TD training:**

11 Candidates from Europe and North America attended. They were divided into two groups and moved between the MO and AE site over a 3-day period. All the candidates also wrote their exams, and all passed. It was a positive experience. There were some recommendations to make it better:

- A published, detailed agenda for each group for each day. This would allow more preparation.
- A quiet classroom to write the test in (this was not available due to some scheduling issues).
- The ability to arrive early and see the actual mogul course build.
- More time in the Judges stand during the event so they can get a better understanding of the process and technology for on line judging as well as data entry by FIS.
- A request for FIS branded clothing once they become licensed TDs. They all want to represent FIS in a professional manner.

#### **Online Courses:**

There are two online courses (level 1 and 2) that are prerequisites for the in-person course. These are being updated for this season. These need to be promoted better to the NSAs for use by all officials entering the stream. Regardless of what individuals' goals are, completing the courses will make for better officials.

More importantly there needs to be a more formal process of enrolling and monitoring of progress so that we can create a database of officials. This is good for FIS and the NSAs.

#### **TD Updates:**

Online and in person updates will contain essentially the same material. Both will treat equally regarding License status. North America will continue doing only online while Europe and Asia will have a combination of both. The intent is that the North American online content be used for any other online updates. Proctors for the online updates will be primarily from their respective time zones.

There is an issue that needs to be addressed where the North American update occurs in early November making it late elsewhere. The timing of the North American online update should be reviewed.

The Mogul Advisory Group (MAG) has been working to ensure the proper implementation of the following topics from MAG discussions.

- Welcome new MAG member – Kaz Horie - KOR
- Reviewed tabled items from FIS Spring Meeting and made recommendations, these included:
  - Endorsed proposal to adjust women's pace time
  - Endorsed addition of rule-following 6405.1.2 Jumps evaluation
  - Endorsed changes made to 6402.3.4-7
- MAG worked with Tina and Marko to create master scores and comments for judging clinic content – Thanks to Kate and Harold for the efforts on this project.

- Consistently review World Cup competitions
  - Discussed current issues being seen in judging:
  - Airs:
    - On Axis tricks aren't being rewarded to athletes are choosing not to perform them e.g. bdF
    - 7oG - axis not being considered, whilst low score for 10op
  - Turns:
    - Still not seeing high turns scores, even those these are the best skiers in the world.
  - Due to the above issues seen in judging, need a more systemic scoring system for judging is required.
  - MAG updated and improved the turn steno to assist the judging process.
  - Judging concerns – Remain the same from spring report.
    - Judges ability to watch training - MAG concerned judges did not watch a lot training.
    - Request to re share the judges guidelines regarding screen size, internet connection and location of judging (home? Office? NSA?)
    - Add guidelines for the following
  - What is the protocol if a judge doesn't see the run (new item)
  - What is the process when judges are not able to submit a score (based on internet disruptions)
    - Continue to consider time zone considerations to limit the amount of judges who would be judging in the middle of the night.
    - Judges should utilize the dial to ensure accuracy of jumps, in particular, grabs. Note: It was used in the 2022 season, resulted in minimal errors in coding and missed grabs.
  - Coaches would like to continue to receive judges video stream & stenos post event. The MAG discusses the topics and then, if needed, assigns the proposal to MAG working groups, the working groups then create a plan of action that is reviewed by the entire MAG and submitted as a proposal if necessary.

- Judging Steno - Implementation of system on how a base scores are created –
  - Addressed Concerns around:
    - Lower scores
    - Promote wider range in scores – Sometimes can be .1 to separate the top skiers turn scores
    - Better explanation of base scores,
    - Created a method of determining base score that will be consistent.
  - Judges Handbook – improved the turns category descriptions, assist the judges and community to better understand what an excellent mogul skiing turn.

A proposal to have a winter World Cup maximum number of 4 days in one location was made at the FIS meeting in Zurich by the AAG and was deferred until the spring meeting. An analysis will be done by the race director and AAG chair this upcoming winter season looking at site readiness upon arrival and # of training days used by teams at each venue.

Currently, as was discussed at length last season and summer; the AAG would like to make it clear that it supports 3 official days of practice on World Cup venues prior to World Cup competition.
