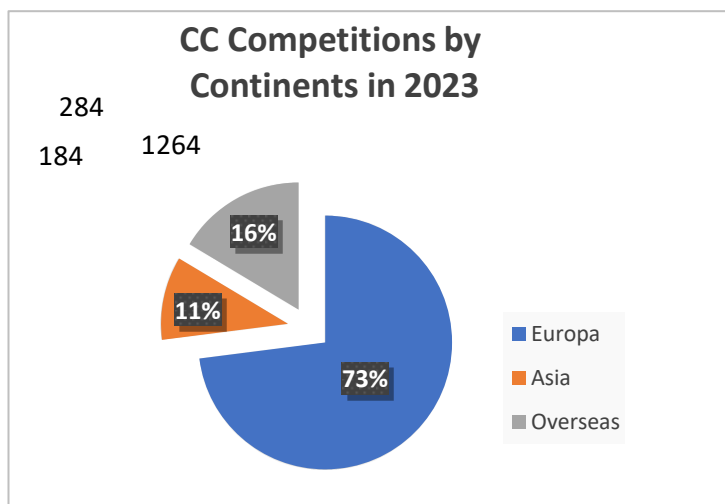
4. Approval of the minutes of the last meeting, Zurich 28.09.2022

The minutes of the last meeting were approved

5. Participation statistics

Chair Ö. Koyuncu (TUR) made a presentation (enclosure) about the CC skiing activities all around the world. He showed the statistics on the number of FIS register athletes and number of FIS registered CC competitions on all over the world by countries and continents.

He mentioned that 6807 men and 4176 women in total 10983 CC athletes from 103 member countries are registered to FIS. Apart from these 103 nations, 23 FIS affiliated member nations are active and have athletes from other FIS disciplines but not CC. He reminded that these numbers are just the competitive athletes doing the performance sport on national/international level but there are thousands of people are doing our sport as recreational sport or competing at the popular/public races without FIS registration.



Last season FIS registered 1732 CC races (without Russia) globally. It was 1828 in 2022. Russia holds around 120 races in a season. Actually, the figures are the similar as last year. Similar percentage between the continents. Europa is still holding big majority of the CC races.

Italy (195), Norway (186), Sweden (172) and Finland (111) are the countries who are organising the biggest number of the CC races in Europa and world.

In Asia, Japan (51) and Kazakhstan (36) are the leading countries. The last OWG organiser China did not organize any FIS CC races due to pandemic restrictions.

USA (122) and Canada (80) are most active countries in Overseas (Americas & Oceania). The interest for CC skiing continue to increase in S. America.

6. 2022/2023 Season review

- FIS Nordic World Ski Championships 2023, Planica (SLO)

Ö. Koyuncu mentioned; 226 men and 156 women in total 382 athletes from 65 countries competed at the season highlight FIS Nordic World Ski Championships 2023 in Planica / Slovenia.

In terms of participation; most popular race formats were 15k (158 athletes from 62 countries) and Sprint (134 athletes from 55 countries) from Men side and 10k (112 athletes from 39 countries) and also Sprint (99 athletes from 35 countries) from Women side. 6 countries shared the medals.

U. Ponikvar said OC Planica specifically tried to help the developing and small size teams. (E.g. cabins for small nations cost but after 1 week the cabins stopped being used. So they went for a big changing room with lockers).

FIS paid for waxing service from Swix for small size teams. 100 pair of skis prepared for them before the races.

- FIS Junior World Ski Championships / U23 Championships, Whistler (CAN)

Ö. Koyuncu presented the participation figures and statistics of JWSC & U23 Championships in Whistler/Canada.

163 athletes (90 Men & 78 Women) from 29 nations competed at the JWSC races. These numbers are less than the last year. 132 Men & 104 Women junior athletes competed in Liygna/Norway 2022. Most popular race formats were 10k (74 M & 60 W) and Sprint (72 M & 60 W) for both gender.

For U23 World Championship; 76 Men, 60 Women total 136 athletes from 26 nations participated. These figures were 85 Men and 75 Women in 2022. Most popular race formats were 10k (64 M & 47 W) and Sprint (62 M & 46 W) for both gender.

When we compare the numbers, it seems to be lower than the previous year. This is normal for the overseas host venues. Main reason is the distance to the organising country and the high traveling time and cost for the teams.

Junior & U23 WSC in next few years -

'24 Planica (5th to 11th February)

'25 CC in Schilparion/Italy (ski jumping will be somewhere else)

'26 Trondheim

Distances / Timing (dates in the calendar) for these championships will also be discussed in CC Committee meeting.

It was suggested the committee had a chance to review the discussion to the Youth & Children's Subcommittee on race distance changes that had been introduced in this year.

Satu Kalajainen (FIN) went over the survey she had presented in the Y&C Subcommittee.

The nations not seen in the survey were asked their thoughts on the changes

- General season experiences/feedback

M. Lamplot (FIS) said generally it was a successful season without any cancellation. CC World Cup organized at 15 venues in 7 countries. 434 athletes from 44 nations, 400 staff members and 16 FIS TDs from 11 nations are participated. Logistic also worked well.

7. FIS Development Programme (FDP)

- 2022/23 Report and 2023/2024 plans

M. Nappey (FIS) reported that two CC Development camps in Val di Fiemme (ITA) and one Coaches Development Camp Planica (SLO) were organized as part of FIS Development Programme in 2022.

First CC Development Camp was on 04-12 September 2022. 26 participants from the NSAs; BIH, CRO, GRE, HUN, IRL, LAT, MNE, POR, ROU and SRB.

Second CC Development Camp was on 11-12 December 2022. 39 participants from the NSAs; ARG, ARM, BRA, BUL, CHI, GRE, HUN, LAT, LBN, MKD, ROU and SRB.

CC Coaches Camp held in Planica (SLO) on 29 September-02 October 2022. 38 Coaches from BIH, BRA, CAN, CRO, ESP, EST, GRE, HUN, LBN, MKD, POL, SRB, SVK and THA participated.

All coaches were trained and supported by FIS experts. Another aim was to develop the cooperation between the NSAs to increase the transfer of knowledge, evaluate new cross country-national ideas and organise shared coaches possibilities.

FIS Development Department planned two Cross Country Camps and one CC Coaches Training Camp (including Para) for the year 2023.

Coaches Camp	: <i>Date</i> : 10 th – 14 th May 2023 <i>Place</i> : Val di Fiemme (ITA) – online & in person <i>Level</i> : Basic Level

Questions raised over the entry requirements for the coach course. M. Nappey answered that this will be put to FIS Development Department section of FIS website. All the information and registration forms also will be sent to the NSAs.

There was a discussion of how we input ideas for developing CC skiing:

- Can we create an International Coaching Pool under the FIS Development Department? Can we get experienced coaching to go camps organised by distant NSA?
- FIS should prepare Technical Educational Materials especially for the new starting or developing NSAs. Even if they have budget and manpower, they don't know how to start and use them. They need a kind of guidance.
- Contribution to the planning and programming of FIS CC Development Camps & Programmes also discussed. Should this subcommittee be inputting into what is happening?

- FIS training camps are only in Europe – is it possible to do same things also in Asia / South America with “FIS Regional CC Training Camps”?
May be combination of FIS/IOC solidarity programmes might be able to be used to get ‘regional’ camps on the go. Some members reported a difficulty getting money from the Solidarity fund and mentioned that unfortunately FDP financial support is always insufficient.

- L. Ribela (BRA) and B. Baldishol (NOR) told Brazil ran a course in the days between 2 race weekends – Norway sent coaches to work on this. If FIS could have a pool that could be accessed by contacting FIS rather than through between personal contacts with the senior nations.

Coach development should be seen as a step by step develop over a years. They need to work together to help the whole sport. A co-ordinated approach to developing of coaches and new nations necessary.

8. CC Development activities in new/developing nations.

Ö. Koyuncu said it's good to see the interest to CC skiing continues to increase in S.America. Most active country is Brasil. Last season, Colombia first time ever organized the FIS Roller Skiing competitions. Colombian athletes are few but regularly competing at the different FIS competitions. Same for Argentina and Chile. Chile organized both ROL and CC FIS competitions while Argentina organized in CC.

In Asia, Thailand and Pakistan are active new comers. Thailand organised FIS ROL races and Pakistan organized CC races second time in row. Krygyzstan,,India and Tajikistan are interesting for CC activities.

China continue to invest in CC skiing. FIS has a contact office and working group in China. Nicola Paulon from China Working Group made a presentation about the China's new snow sports project “Future Stars-China Youth Skiing Open” (enclosure). The project focuses on U12, U18, U21 age categories with 100 kids and includes national and international competitions and training camps.

9. Any other matters arising

Ö. Koyuncu brought the last situation of CC Continental Cups (COC) on the table.

EEC : UKR moved to SC (Slavic Cup)
RUS & BLR banned
Only KAZ stayed in EEC

SC : CZE Moved to OPA
POL, SVK & HUN applied to move to OPA
UKR will stay alone in SC

In reality only two big COC, OPA and Scandinavia and Balkan Cup will remain in Europa. The function and structure of COC system has to be evaluated and if necessary should be revised. CCC also aware the issue and wants to find a solution. Chair requested from the members to send their thoughts to him.

It was requested from CCC to form a working group between the CC subcommittees to collaborate and make a brain storm on the ideas and projects fort he youth and development projects,etc..Chair asked who wants to be candidate for the this WG?
R. Young (GBR) and Ö.Koyuncu are nominated. Chair also proposed F. Keirouz (LBN) and Yeui Gyu Im (KOR) for this WG. Aim of this WG to bring the proposals by

September. All the countries can contribute to the Working Group.

F. Keirouz (LBN) and B. Savehsemshaki (IRI) criticized the new CC FIS points calculation system. They are thinking that the new system will damage their improvement, not fair and prevent their participation to the title events like OWG & WSC. They expressed the worries about the effect on them (ie they have to long travel to get options where they can score decent points P.Mach (CZE) explained the new system and told there won't be any negative effects.

U. Ponikvar (SLO) Uros spoke to the point looking for "Fairness" across the whole sport. (FIS are worried by the 'manipulation' races to produce better FIS points & the ethical consideration that this brings). This probably also need changes in criteria for entry into WC & OWG.

B. Savehsemshaki (Iran) said that this new system should be corrected in the FIS Council. He pointed out that the other FIS disciplines are not following the CC system to solving this.

L. Brawand (FIS) informed about the FIS new media plan. He made a presentation on the figures: who & how they see what goes in our sports – there is a huge decrease in younger generations in watching live TV. It is more on digital formats. Nowadays the trend is changing from linear broadcasts to personalised content. FIS aim to take advantage of this in the new media content. Need to collaborate to produce best range of things. The products has to be high quality.

The Tik took account is getting great engagement and FIS wants to make the channel available to all.

10. Next meeting

The next meeting will be in Zurich, 27-29.09 2023

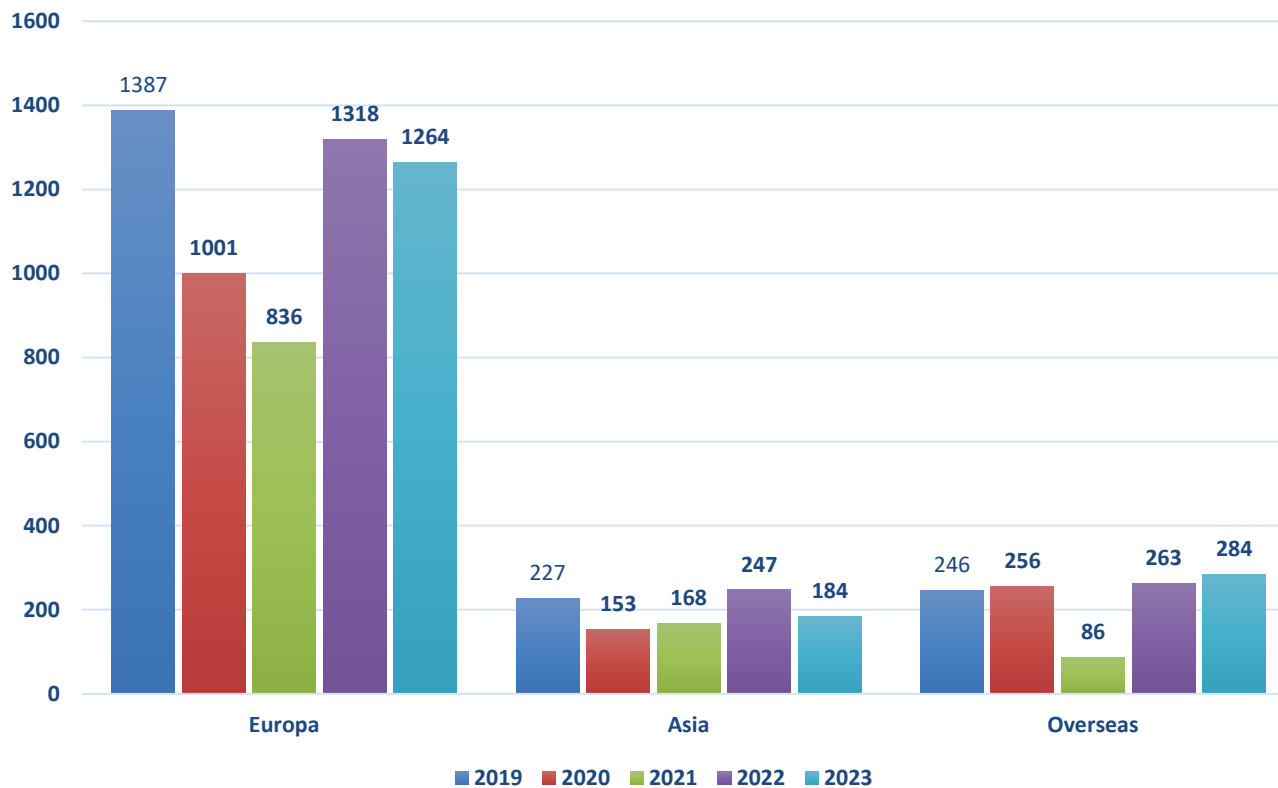

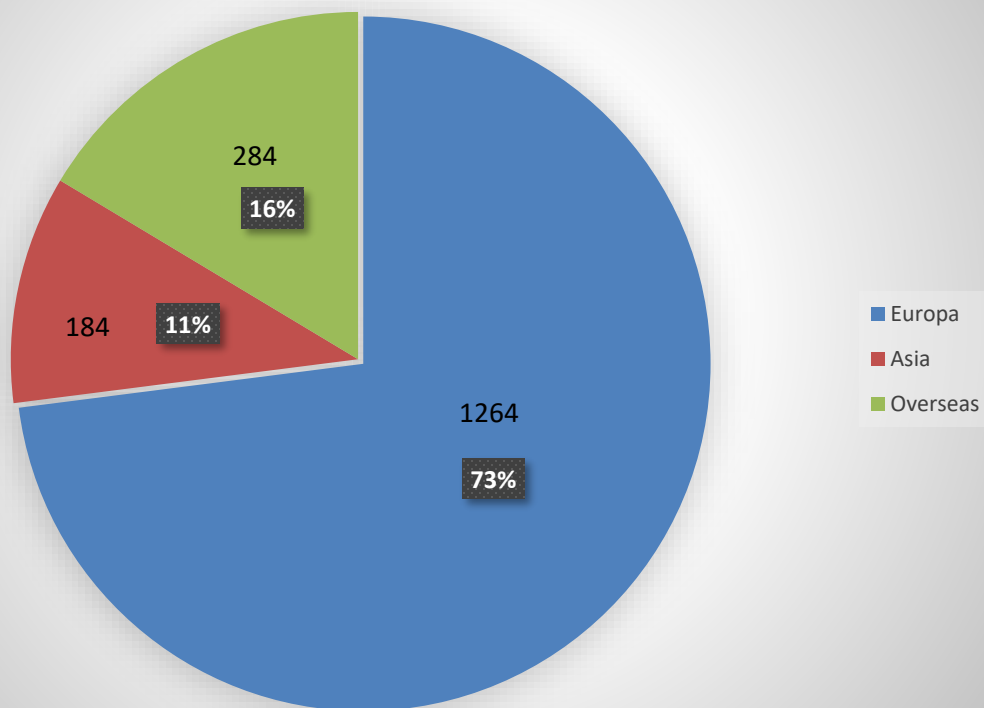
TOTAL CC COMPETITIONS BY YEAR



Total Numbers of CC Competitions by Continents



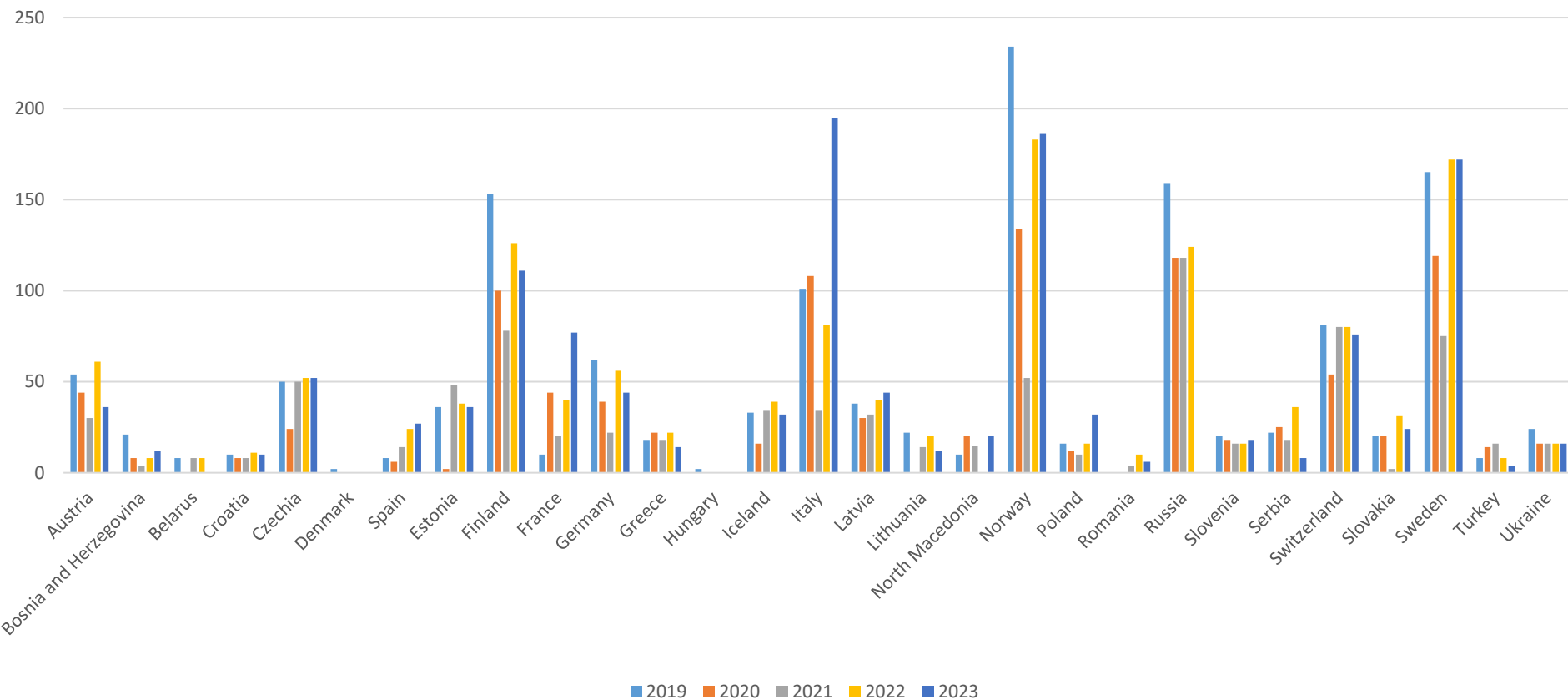

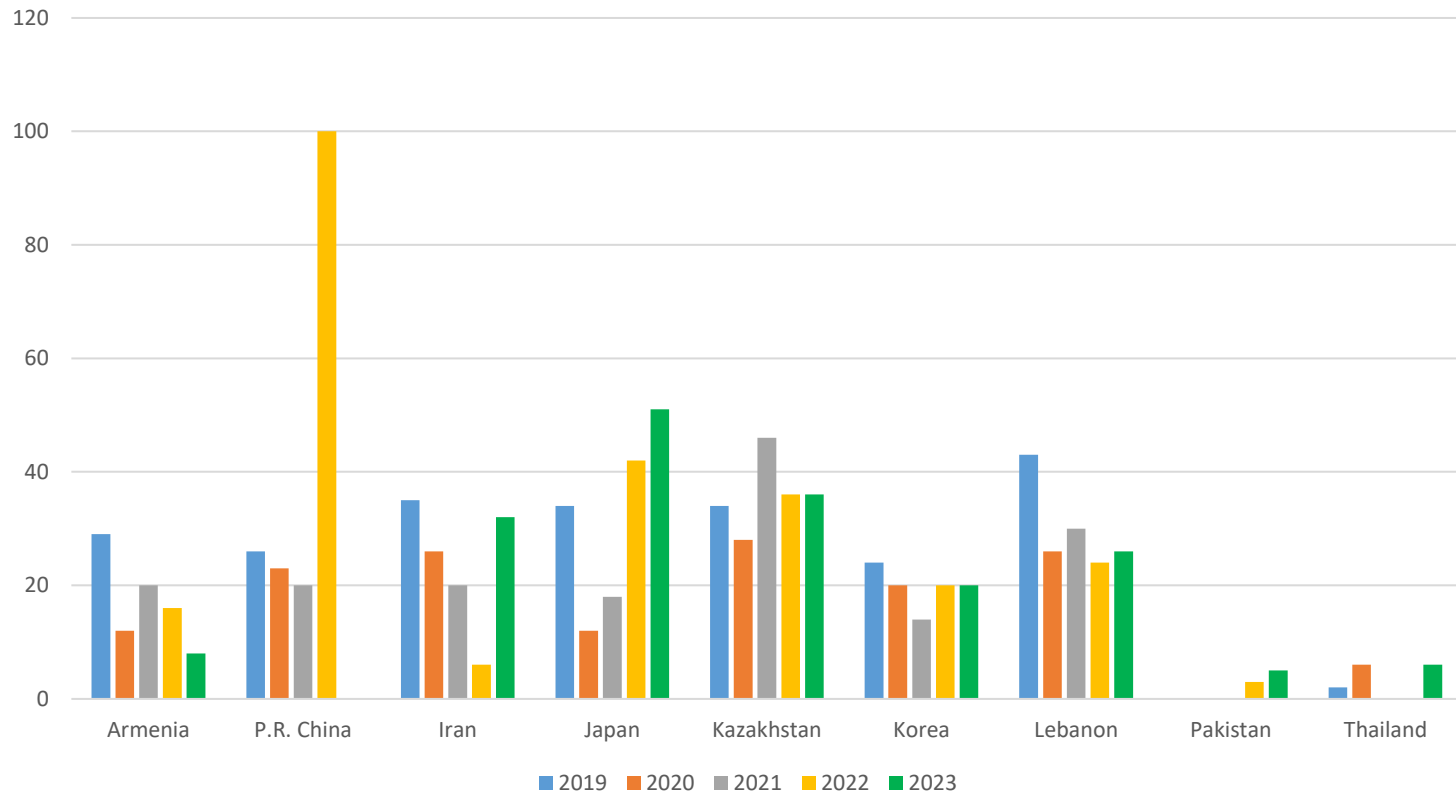
Number of CC Competitions in Europa by Countries

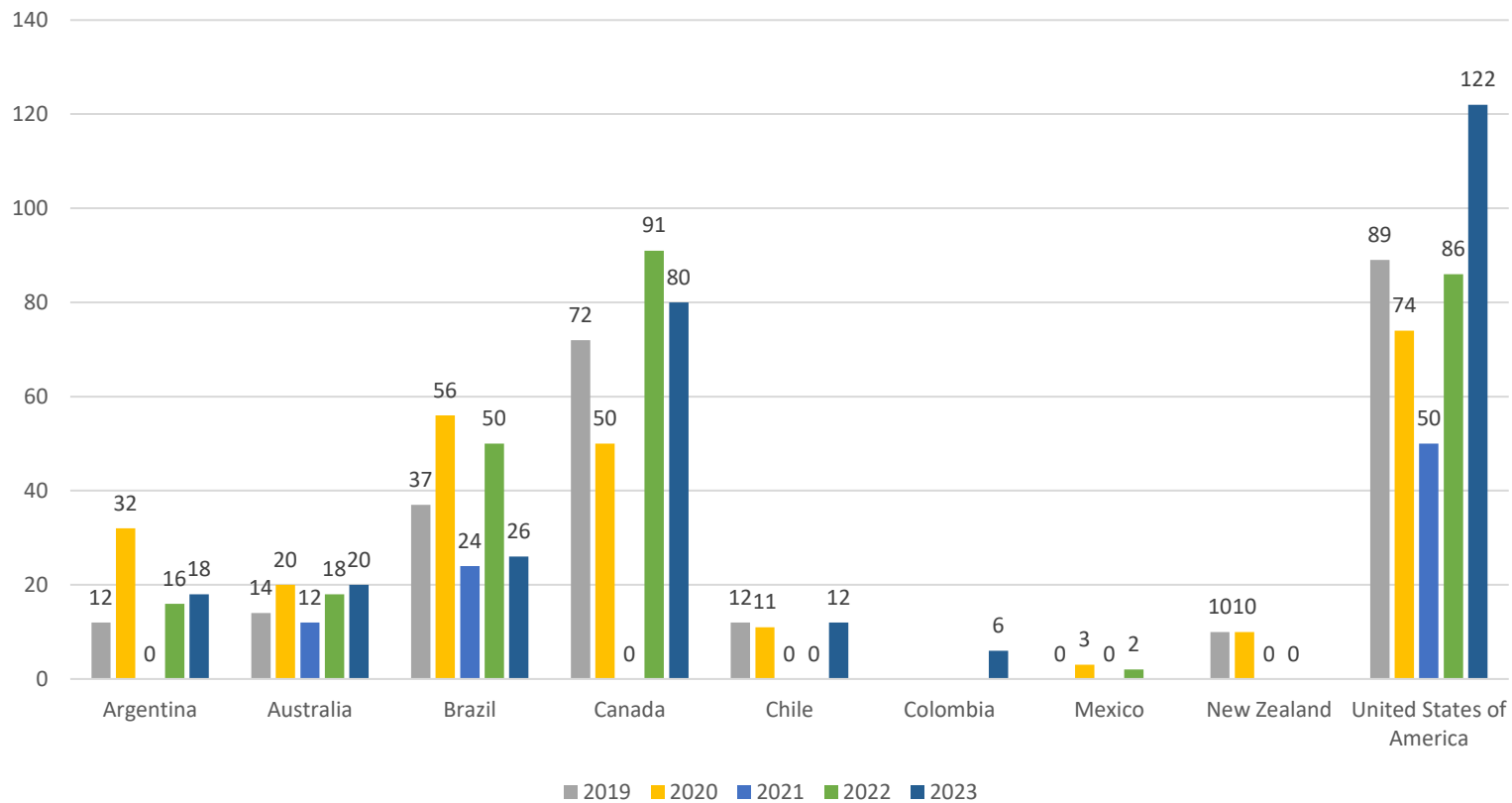
Numbers of CC Competitions in Asia

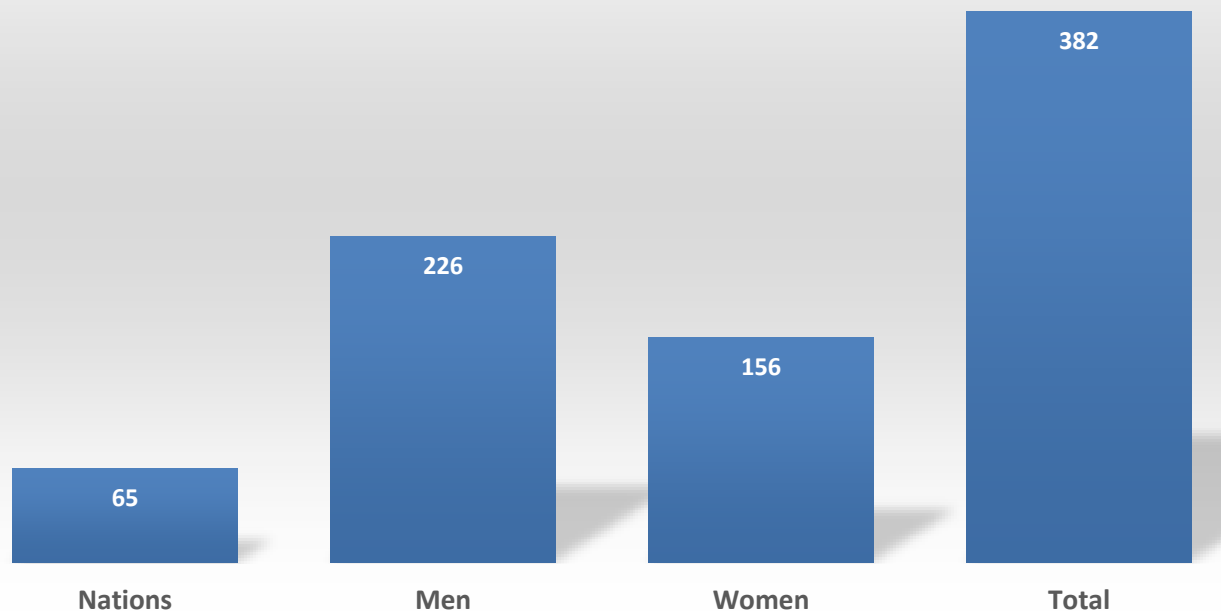

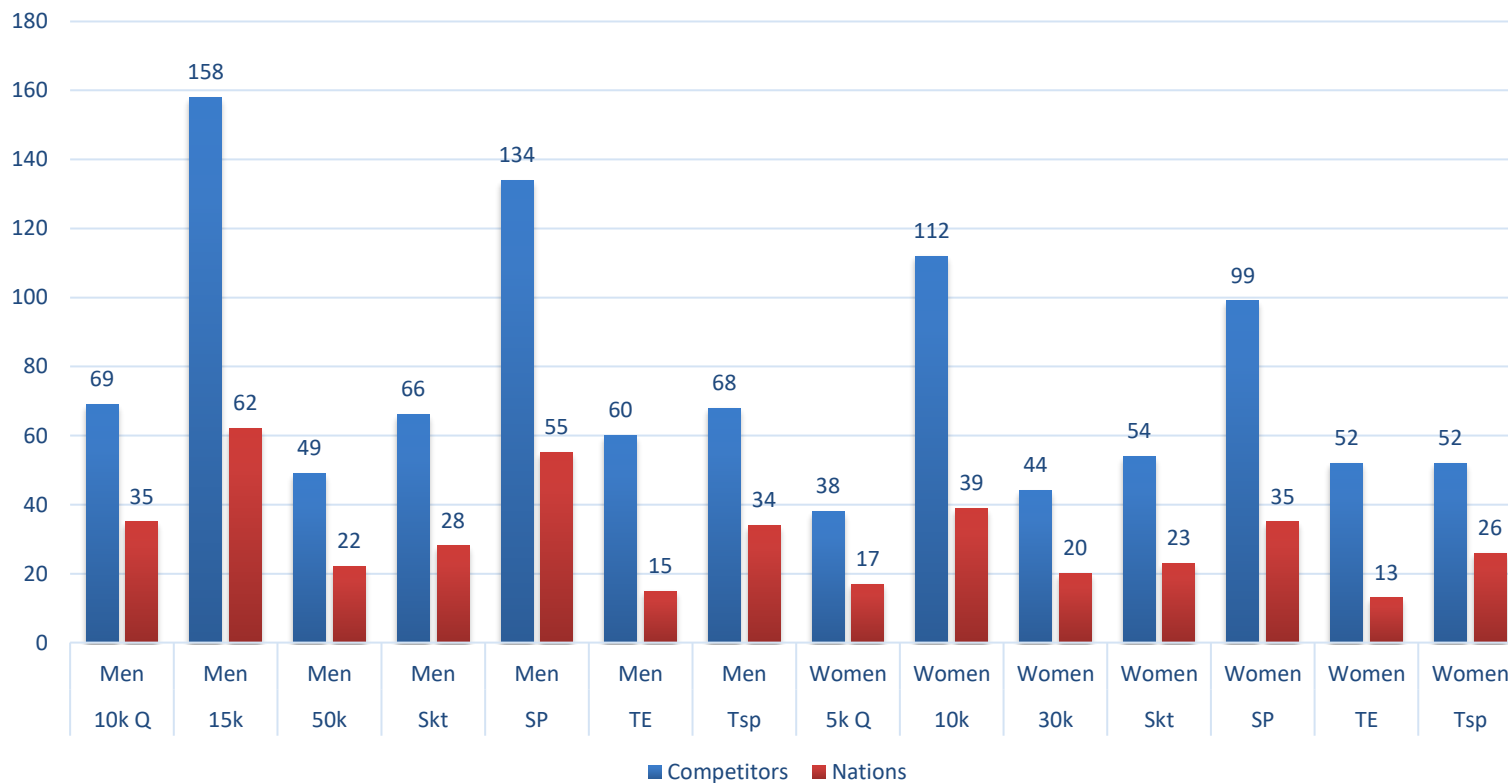


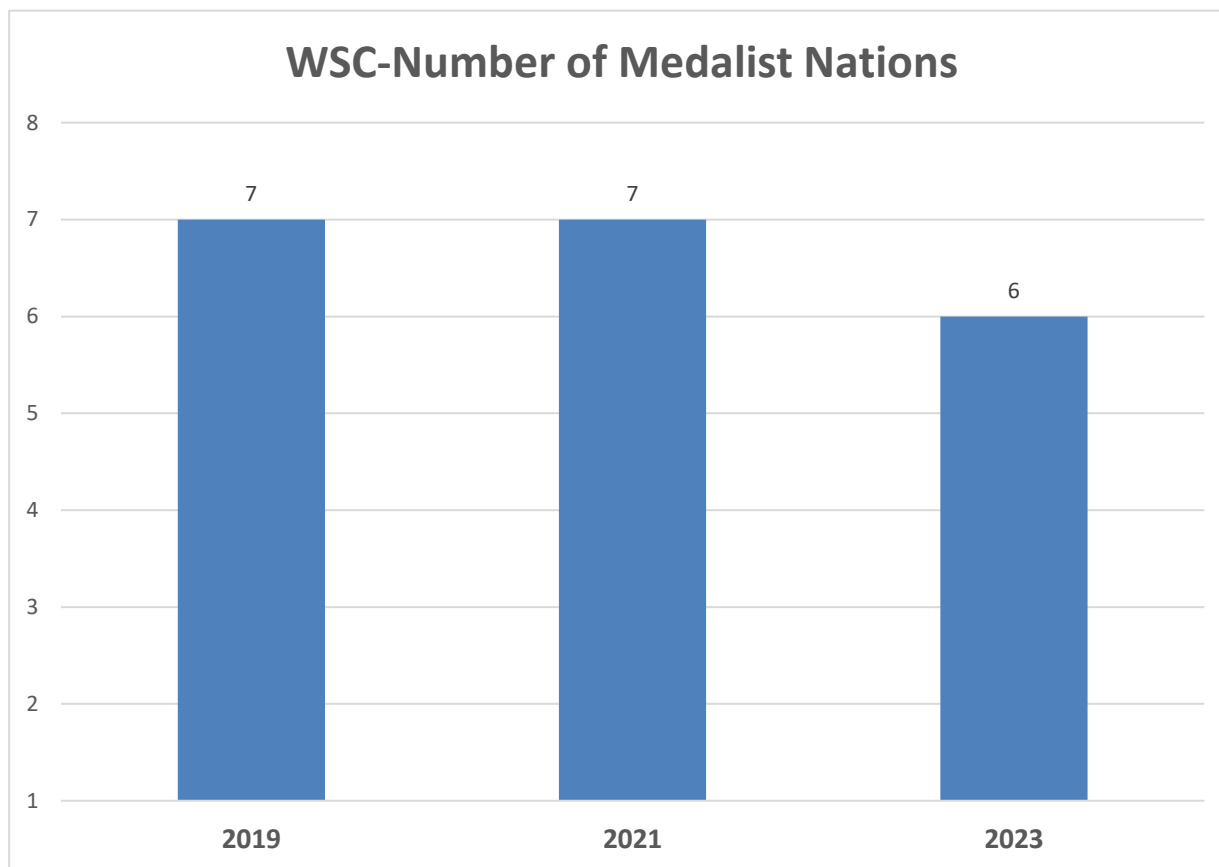

WSC 2023 Participation by Race Formats



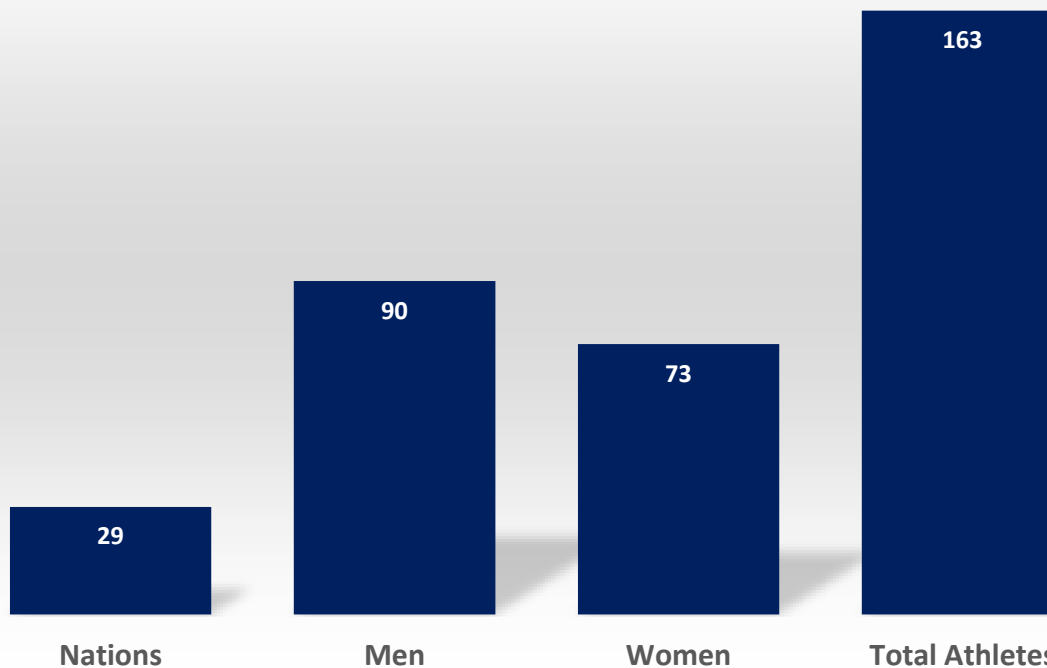




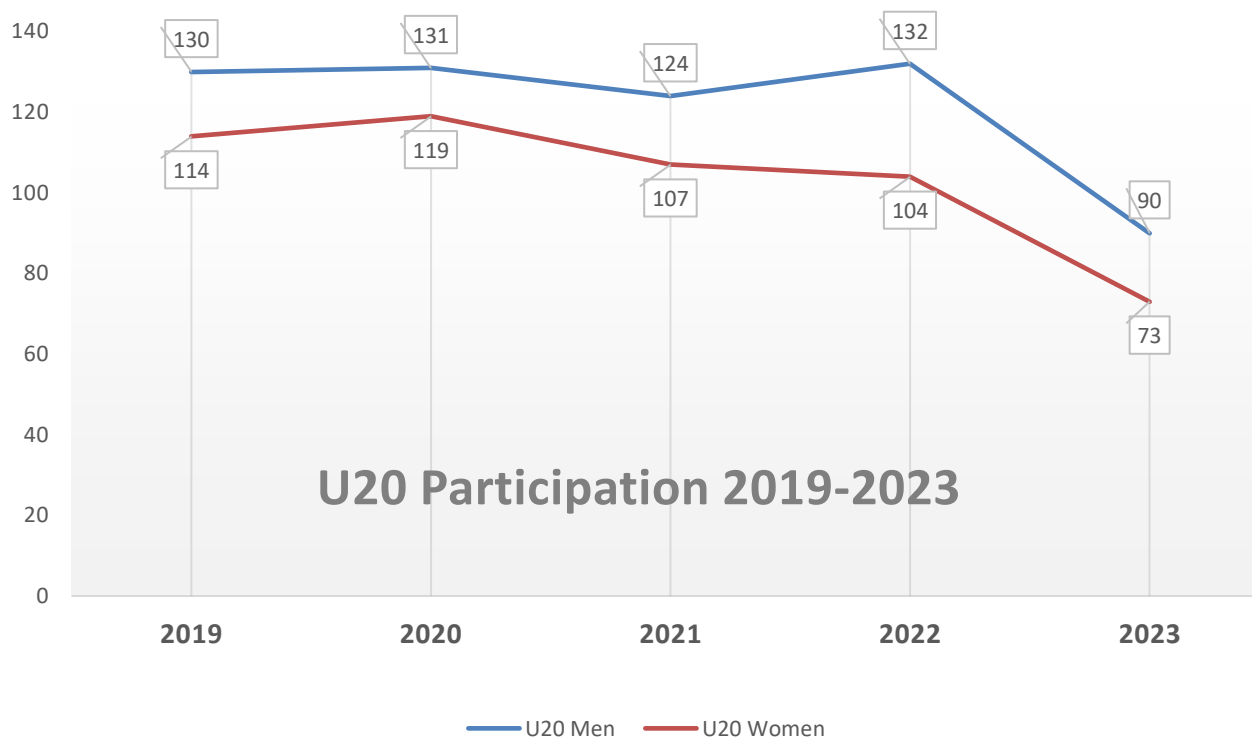

JWSC 2023 Participation

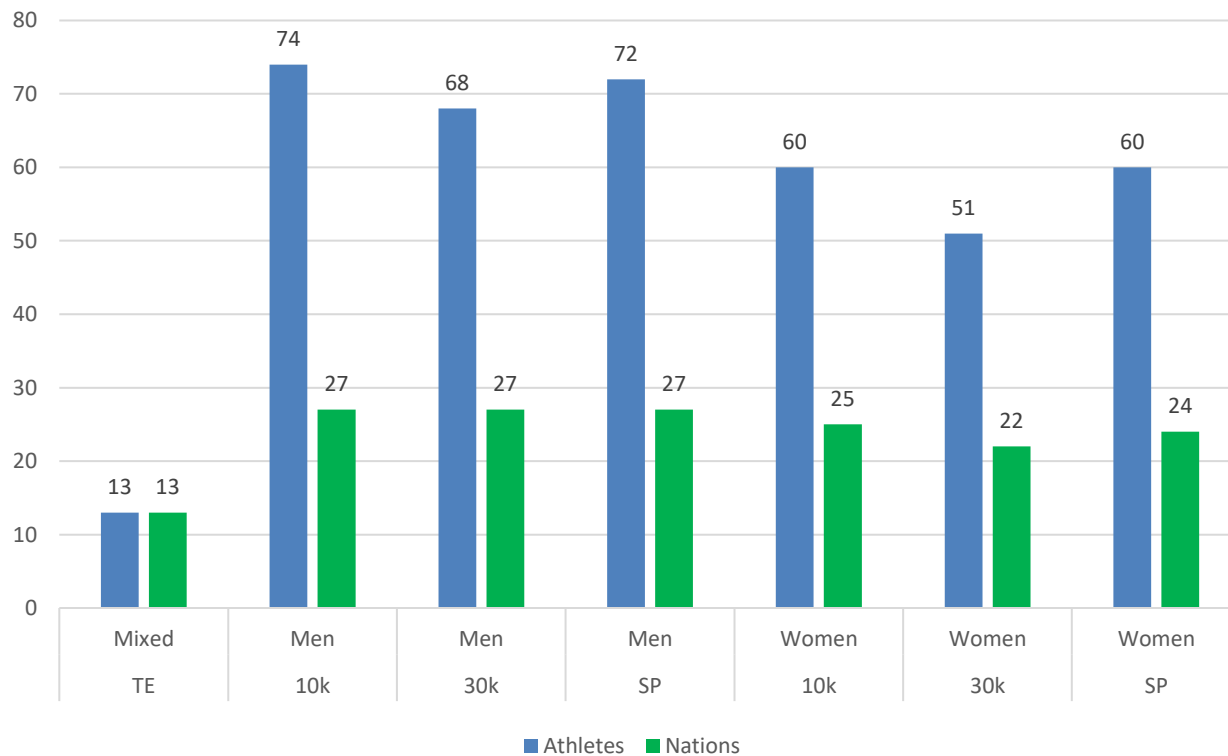

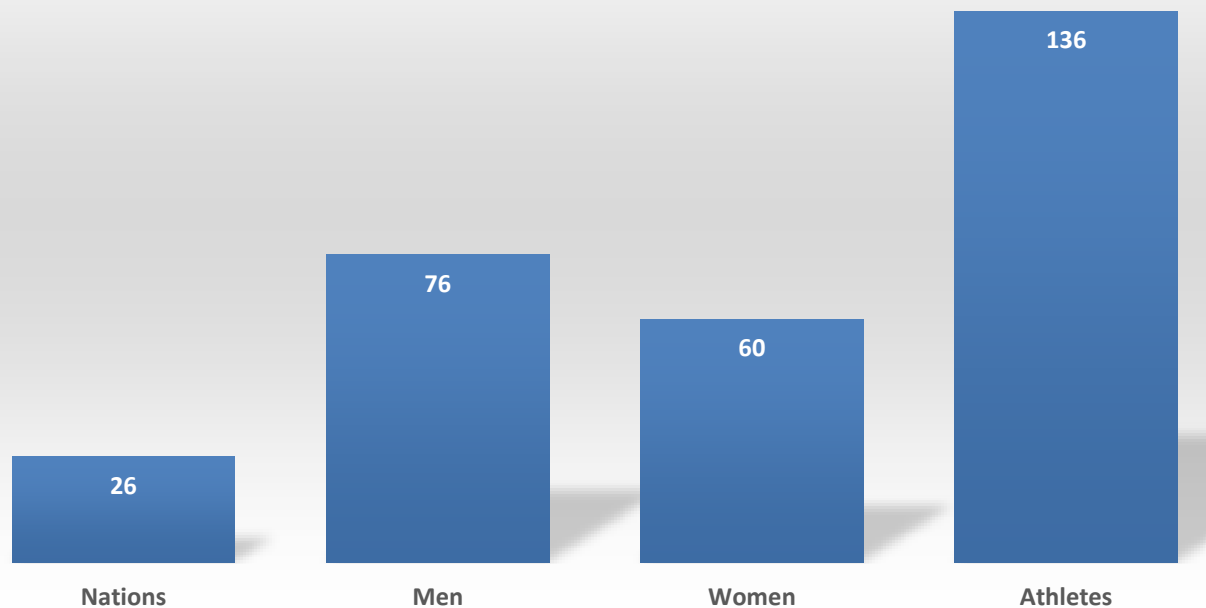

JWSC 2023 Participation by Race Formats

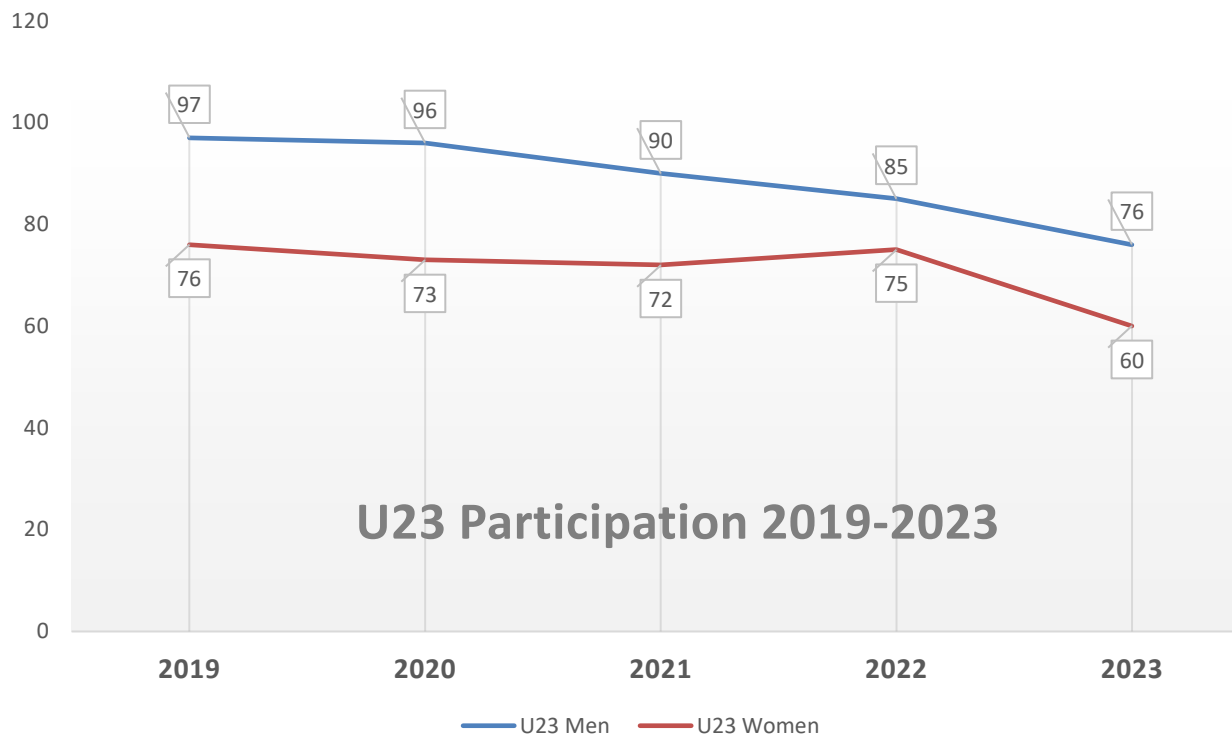

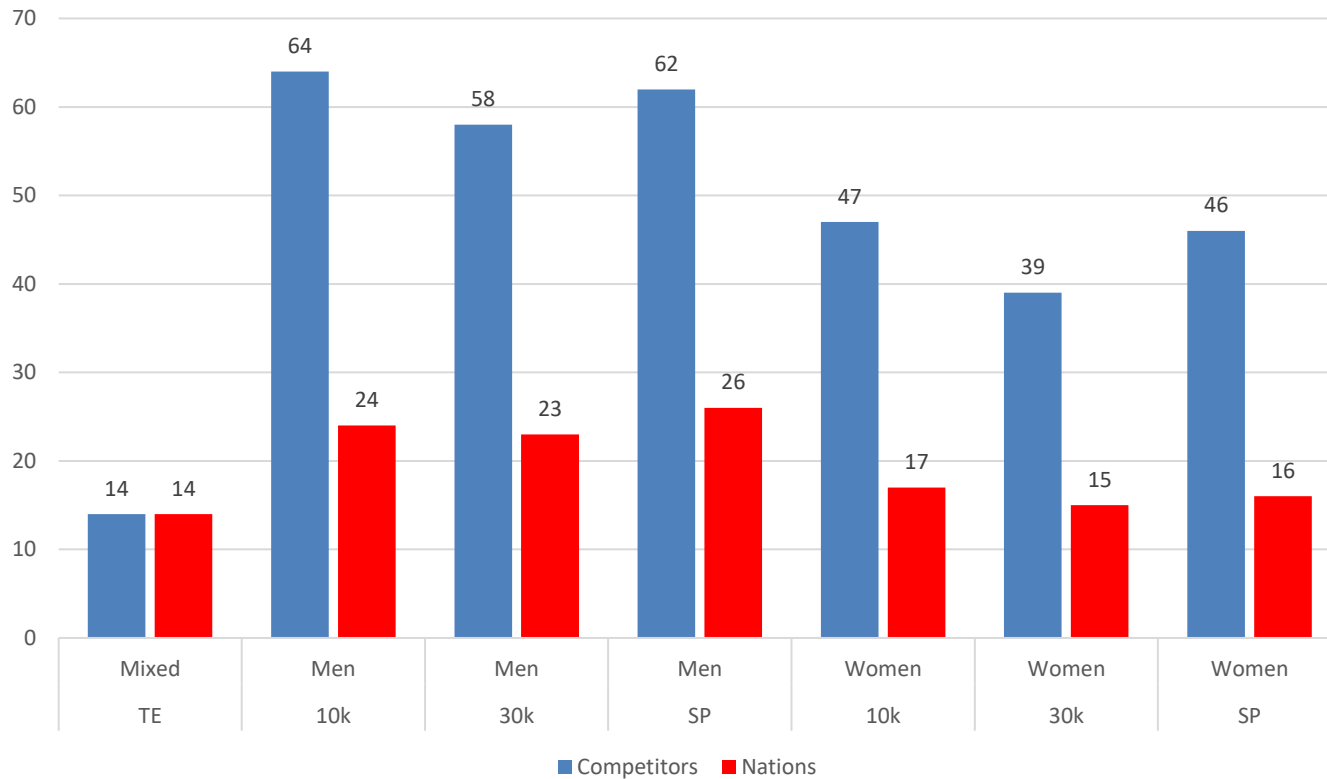

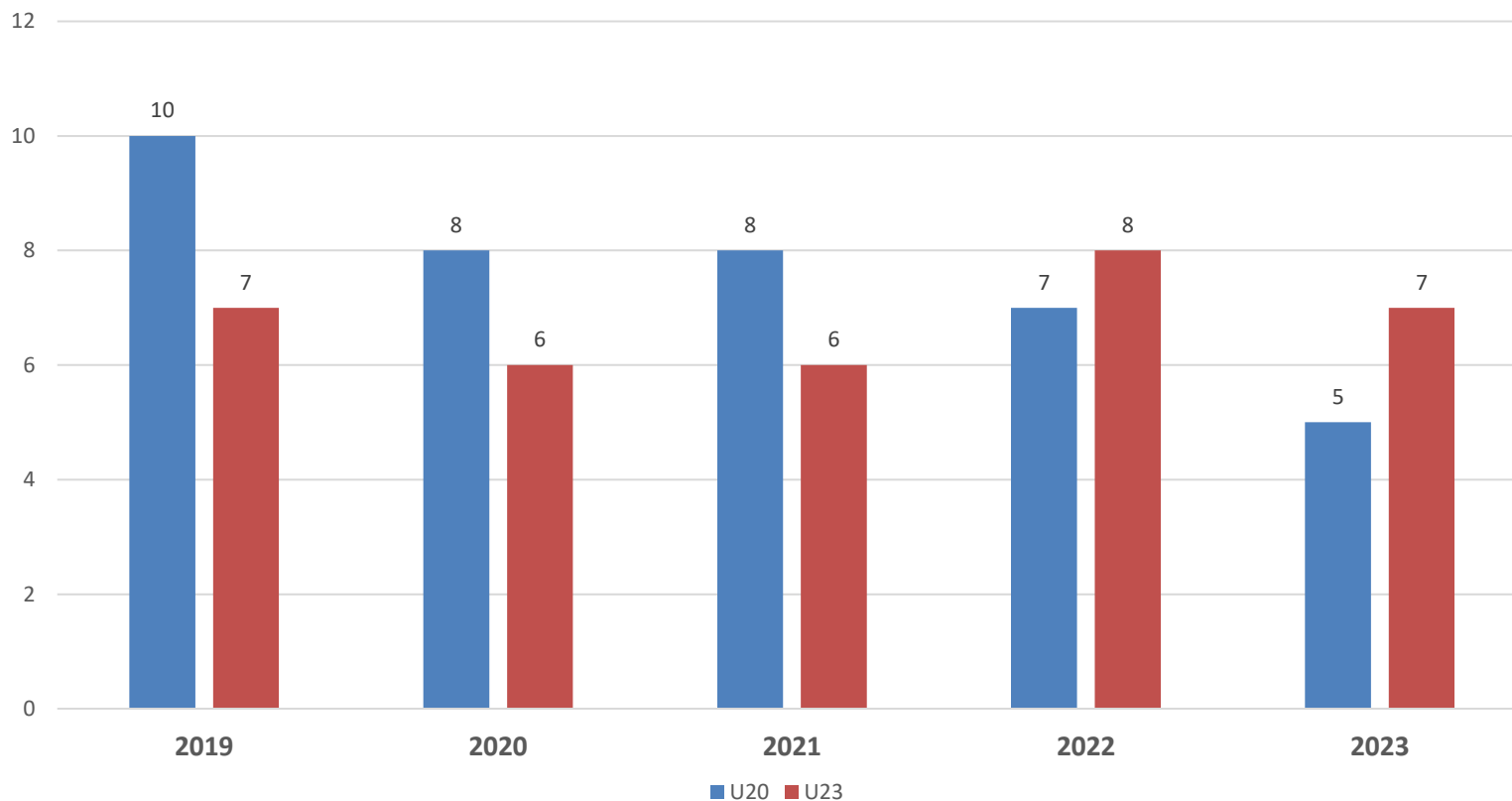
